Maroubra

- A famous event in Maroubra was the sinking of a ship called the Hereward in 1898.
- It was a fully rigged iron ship weighing 1,513 tonnes.
- It was heading up to Newcastle when it was hit by gale force winds.
- It was shipwrecked at the northern end of Maroubra Beach.
- There were still parts of the ship left till 1967, until it was decided to blast the last pieces of the ship away. There were many failed attempts to re-float it.
- However, even to this day, when there are big tides and swells that wash away sand from the beach, parts of the ship have been exposed.
- There is a street in Maroubra named after the ship.
- Average house price \$1.9 Million.

Hurstville Grove

- Was originally called Gannon's Forest
- Later named after William Grove, a member of the First Fleet, who settled in the area. He was a Horse Handler.
- In late 1800's the area was renowned for its wild Brumbies who roamed the area.
- Maybe this is why William Grove settled there?

- He and others caught the wild Brumbies and trained them up as Racehorses. In fact, one of their horses, The Stud, ran in the 1906 Melbourne Cup. It didn't win.
- Hence the names of some of the streets in the area - Stallion Pde, Mare St, Gelding Lane etc.
- It's a very small suburb - only 2,392 residents
- Average house \$1.5 Million.
