## Penshurst

Named after the Village of Penshurst in Kent, England

Originally a forested area, with small farms

Railway Station opened in 1890

20% of population Chinese – only 47% of people living in Penshurst were born in Australia

Penshurst was home to two very famous Australians:

**Ken Rosewall** – known as “Muscles” – Tennis Champion – he won 8 Grand Slam Singles titles during 1950’s, 60’s and 70’s – his first in 1953 and his last in 1974 – that’s a 21 year time frame – he was 40 years old when he won his final Grand Slam at Wimbledon – he was ranked the No.1 player in the world in 8 different years. He is 86 years old.

**Jack Brabham** – world champion car racing driver – won 3 World Championships – 1959, 1960 and 1966. His background was as a Mechanic, so he helped design his own Racing Cars. When he won the 1966 World Championship, he became the only driver, to this day, to win a World Championship in one of his own cars. He was Australian of the Year in 1966, and knighted in the same year. He died in 2014 aged 88.


